**4. FIRST AID MEASURES**

**First aid measures**

**Eye contact** Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Seek immediate medical attention/advice.

**Skin contact** Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of water while removing all contaminated clothes and shoes. Wash contaminated clothing and shoes before reuse. For severe burns, immediate medical attention is required.

**Inhalation** Remove to fresh air. Administer oxygen if breathing is difficult. Call a physician immediately.

**5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES**

**Suitable extinguishing media**

**Protective equipment and precautions for firefighters**

As in any fire, wear self-contained breathing apparatus pressure-demand, MSHA/NIOSH (approved or equivalent) and full protective gear. Cool containers with flooding quantities of water until well after fire is out. Non-combustible, substance itself does not burn but may decompose upon heating to produce corrosive and/or toxic fumes. Prevent entry into waterways, sewers, basements or confined areas.

**6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES**

**Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures**

**Personal precautions** Use personal protection recommended in Section 8. Ensure adequate ventilation, especially in confined areas.

**For emergency responders** Isolate area. Keep unnecessary personnel away.

**Methods and material for containment and cleaning up**

**Methods for containment** Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible absorbent material, (e.g. sand, earth, diatomaceous earth, vermiculite) and place in container for disposal according to local / national regulations (see Section 13).

**Methods for cleaning up** Collect spillage. Soak up with inert absorbent material. Sweep up and shovel into suitable containers for disposal. After cleaning, flush away traces with water. Ventilate affected area.

**7. HANDLING AND STORAGE**

**Precautions for safe handling**

**Advice on safe handling** Use personal protection recommended in Section 8. Avoid contact with skin, eyes or clothing. Use only in well-ventilated areas. Avoid breathing vapors or mists. Wash thoroughly after handling. Handle in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety practice.

**Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities**

**Storage Conditions** Keep containers tightly closed in a dry, cool and well-ventilated place. Containers must be vented. Keep/store only in original container. Keep from freezing. NFPA Class 1 oxidizer. Oxidizers need to be separated by at least 25 feet from flammable and combustible liquid containers. Separation shall be maintained by dikes, drains, or floor slopes to prevent flammable liquid leakage from encroaching on the separation (NFPA 400 15.2.12.13.1). At least one side of each pile of oxidizers shall be on an aisle (NFPA 400, 15.2.12.3). NFPA Class 1 oxidizers must be separated by at least 8 feet from incompatible materials and combustible commodities (NFPA 400 Table 15.3.2.2.2(A)(b)).

**Incompatible materials** Chlorinated compounds. Alkali. Ammonia. Turpentine. Cyanides. Sulfides. Carbides. Alcohols. Hydrogen Sulfide. Certain soft metals. Organic material. Combustible material. Reducing agent.
